Memorial Day Parade

The City of Washington will remember and honor members of the military who sacrificed their lives with a Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 29, 2017. At 10 a.m., the parade will step off from Heartland Bank and continue along S. Main Street to Oakwood Drive and ending just west of the Veteran's Memorial in the Glendale Cemetery.

Immediately following the parade, a remembrance ceremony will be held at Glendale Cemetery. Max Tessier is the featured speaker at the ceremony.

The parade is sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 9016, American Legion Post 100, and the City of Washington. Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts are welcome to participate in the parade and should meet in the Heartland Bank parking lot at 9:45 am.

There will be no street closures associated with the parade. Members of the Washington Police Department will temporarily block traffic to accommodate the parade.
