Jefferson & N. Main Paving Project Update

The Jefferson Street paving project between Wilmor Road and Lawndale Avenue will soon enter the second phase of construction. Beginning the first week of October, the existing asphalt will be milled, weather permitting. Shortly after milling, the road will be repaved. During both the milling and paving operations, there will be no road closures or detours. Partial and temporary lane closures will occur during this moving operation. Signs and flaggers will direct traffic.

Concurrent to the Jefferson Street project, repairs will also be made to N. Main Street between the Historic Square and the bridge over Farm Creek just south of Hilldale Avenue. During the milling and subsequent paving of this segment of N. Main Street, on-street parking will be restricted on the west side of N. Main Street. There will be no road closures or detours on N. Main Street. However, the north and south bound traffic lanes will be shifted as work progresses. Signs and flaggers will direct traffic. An alternative to on-street parking is the public parking lot at N. Main Street and Zinser Place.

There will be no milling or paving operations in school zones during morning drop-off or afternoon pickup times.

Motorists are encouraged to be aware of workers within the zone and to allow for extra travel time in these areas.
