special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

- WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and
- WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and
- **WHEREAS,** trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and
- WHEREAS, we plan on continuing our commitment for managing our trees in Washington; and
- **WHEREAS**, we continue to remove damaged trees, plant new trees, and having myself plant an Arbor Day tree in a city park.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Gary W. Manier, Mayor of the City of Washington, Illinois, do hereby proclaim April 28, 2017, as Arbor Day in the City of Washington, and I urge all citizens to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands.
