There were 0.0 Shifts in July where 1 Officer and a Sergeant were working.

There were 63.0 Shifts in July where 2 Officers and a Sergeant were working. This is considered minimum staffing for some shifts.

There were 29.0 Shifts in July where 3 Officers and a Sergeant were working. This is considered minimum staffing for certain shifts, i.e., Fridays or Saturdays on 2nd or 3rd Shifts.

There were 0.0 Shifts in July where 3 officers were on duty without a Sergeant working due to Sergeant's days off, training or vacations.

There were 1.0 shifts in July where 4 Officers and a Sergeant were working. These are typically high volume busier shifts in terms of call load, traffic , etc.

17.0 Overtime shifts occurred in July to cover for Officer's vacations, comp days, training days, etc.

There were 18.0 Shifts where Sergeants were Hired Back for Overtime in July.
