SUBJECT: 2019 Orthophotography Project

DATE: September 25, 2018

The City of Washington has been asked to partner in a flight to produce new orthophotograpy within Tazewell County. The City last participated in a similar project in the spring of 2015. At that time, the flight produced 6-inch resolution for the entire area. There has been significant cost savings by doing this as a regional project and the goal is to have the orthophotography updated every 3-4 years for the County and its municipalities.

This project would update the aerial photos from 2015. We have been asked to provide a share of the cost based on the number of improved parcels within the city limits and 1.5 mile extraterritorial planning jurisdiction. The total project cost would be offset from a grant obtained through the Tri-County Regional Planning Commission (TCRPC) of about \$45,000. Tazewell County has proposed to incur 50% of the cost with the municipalities sharing the other 50%.

The vendor (EagleView Pictometry) has offered two proposals: 1) 6-inch imagery for the full county and the Rapid Access – Disaster Response Program, which provides post-event imagery within 2-3 days within a disaster. The municipal cost for this is about \$6,600 with Washington's share at a not-to-exceed amount of \$1,007. 2) 3-inch imagery with 4-way oblique within the incorporated portions of the County, 6-inch imagery for the unincorporated portions, and 9-inch imagery with 4-way obliques within the unincorporated portions. This would allow access to Change Finder, which shows the before-and-after photos to more easily determine changes in infrastructure, land use, and the environment since 2015. This also includes maintenance for EagleView's Rapid Access Disaster Response Program, which provides post-disaster imagery within 2-3 days after an event. The municipal cost for this is \$88,250 with Washington's share at a not-to-exceed amount of \$13,464.

The County has offered to pay the entire bill in advance of the project and would then send an invoice to each municipality in the Fall of 2019 in order to adequately budget for the project. The County has also offered a three-year payment plan for any municipalities desiring that option. Approval of either proposal would require an intergovernmental agreement with Tazewell County. Tazewell County would be the project manager and handle all of the quality control issues with EagleView. It is expected that the flight would occur in the spring of 2019 and the product would be delivered later that fall.

General discussion is planned at the October 1 Public Works Committee meeting before seeking City Council authorization.
