## CITY OF WASHINGTON, ILLINOIS SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING - MONDAY, APRIL 13, 2020 REMOTE WEB MEETING 6:30 P.M.

Public Hearing: Proposed FY2020-2021 Budget

Interim City Engineer John Anderson requested Council authorization to award the bid for the N. Lawndale Reconstruction Project to Stark Excavating in an amount not to exceed \$1,798,518.76 to provide for the public infrastructure portion of the project. He provided background on the bid opening process sharing that six bids were received for the project. He shared the two lowest bidders did not meet the IDOT Prequalification requirements that were requested as part of the bid. He shared that after reviewing the remaining bids and receiving legal direction from the City Attorney, it is recommended to award the bid to Stark Excavating as the third lowest bidder and holding the required IDOT Prequalification. Alderman Dingledine moved and Alderman Brownfield seconded to authorize the request as presented. On roll call the vote was:
