WHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and

WHEREAS, we plan on continuing our commitment for managing our trees in Washington; and

WHEREAS, we continue to remove damaged trees, plant new trees, and having myself plant an Arbor Day tree in a city park.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Gary W. Manier, Mayor of the City of Washington, Illinois, do hereby proclaim April 23, 2021, as Arbor Day in the City of Washington, and I urge all citizens to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands.
