**Agenda Item**: Resolution – Maintaining the Number of Alderpersons and Wards

**Explanation**: The City of Washington's 2020 Census population of 16,071 was certified by the Secretary of

State late last year. The City's population falls between the range of 15,001 and 20,000, which dictates that there be ten alderpersons and five wards. However, municipalities may choose to retain the number of alderpersons and wards that existed prior to the most recent decennial Census. The City approved a resolution in 2011 to maintain the status quo after the 2010

Census population fit into the same range.

Following discussion at the April 11 Committee of the Whole meeting, the consensus was to keep the same number of alderpersons and wards. As a result, attached is a resolution that would retain the eight alderpersons and four wards that existed prior to the 2020 Census.
