

City Council Meeting Minutes Public Hearing

Monday, September 18, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. Washington Fire Department Training Room - 200 N. Wilmor Road, Washington, Illinois

Call to Order	Mayor Manier called the regular meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. with a quorum present.

Public Hearing	At 6:31 p.m., City Administrator Snider opened the public hearing. He shared details regarding the request by City Council to upgrade the equipment and stream City meetings. He stated that the cost includes audio visual equipment and fixed furniture. He also stated that this is a proposed budget amendment for \$160,000. Mr. Snider noted that there is a first reading of an ordinance at tonight's Council meeting. Mayor Manier invited public comments. Township resident Allison Montgomery stated that she refused to use the provided microphones because the Council has not always used them. She stated that at the last meeting Alderpersons Blundy and Butler got in a fight because there are four microphones for eight people. Ms. Montgomery stated that she wants to know how many microphones will be used and asked why we are going from 0 to 120. She said every meeting should be accessible to everyone. Ms. Montgomery asked how 100 people would fit in this room if they have a large meeting like Trails Edge. She also stated that she has filed a complaint with OMA about the audio-visual meeting. Ms. Montgomery asked if we are going to go into questions now or only when Council goes into discussion. Administrator Snider stated that the has informed Council meetings will be streamed and clarified that this was directed to him from Council. He shared that this has worked well for other cities. Ms. Montgomery continued by asking that if this item fails tonight, will we put money towards a different system? She stated that the Attorney General gave a response and stated that we don't have a system that allows people to hear if people jingle their keys or if kids play video games. She said they need to discuss as a council how they would go to a bigger room if needed. Ms. Montgomery stated that she is curious how Catherine Street is looking for meetings, and Council may ask for more microphones. He reminded Ms. Montgomery that additional funding for Catherine Street has not been brought to ccuncil and money can move in specific are
