**Background:** Before the fire, the Public Works used the western portion for both vehicle and equipment storage and the PD used the eastern portion for equipment and evidence storage. The antique Police Car was also stored in the garage in the northeast corner of the building as well.

The Township Road Commissioner approached the City of the potential to adjust the usage of the Jefferson Street Building to allow for storage of both the antique police car and fire truck. The request would also be to switch the current garage doors along Main Street with Glass Garage doors to allow the public to see and enjoy the antique vehicles.

The Police Department and Public Works Department would like to continue using the storage space for equipment.

**Action Requested**: Staff requests discussion on if Council would like to pursue the relocation of the antique fire truck to the Jefferson Street building.
