MAYOR – Liliya Stevens

On May 5, 2025....six months ago (as of this posting, actually a few days shy of six months) I was sworn in as your Mayor of the City of Washington.

If you are a regular Council Report reader, you have noticed that since May of this year, the Mayor portion is a new regular section of the Council Report.

The purpose of my portion of the Council Report is for a record to be established for persons who wish to be Mayor in the future. A record to give the community information on what a mayor does in addition to presiding over City meetings.

During these first six months, I have shared the names of regularly scheduled committee/commission meetings that I attend to represent the City of Washington. The next mayor will have an understanding of meeting expectations, outside of our regularly scheduled City and Committee meetings.

Our community has various regularly scheduled events that, as mayor, are enjoyable as well as important to attend. For example, in the summer we have Rove & Ramble. Autumnfest was recently held and coming up this week-end the Square's Holiday Open House. I also regularly attend Washington Chamber of Commerce ribbon cuttings as a representative of the City.

There are special events that, as mayor, I am invited to and enjoy attending for example, this past Wednesday's Trunk or Treat at the Washington Senior Living facility.

The Washington Chamber of Commerce has invited me to say a few words at the Community Prayer Breakfast coming up in November. This is a Chamber event, formerly known as the Mayor's Prayer Breakfast. I have been attending this event for many years, well before I was involved in City politics.

Coming up in December, before the Community Sing, during the Candlelight Stroll event, I have been invited to light the tree on the Square. I have attended the Candlelight Stroll for many, many years and am appreciative of being able to part of this special event this year.

In the Council Report I have shared events that I, as mayor, am invited to attend to say a few congratulatory words. For example, in last week's Council Report I shared my invite to WCHS to honor the boys golf team for their historic season.

There was no 'playbook', manual, binder handed to me on May 5th. Our Municipal Code, in Section 2-213 (a) describes that the mayor is the chief executive officer of the city and shall preside at all meetings of the council...and other City related duties are described but nothing in terms of time commitments in the community/neighboring communities.

These first six months have been both challenging and rewarding. When people ask how it's been going, my response is there are more good experiences than bad, more positives than negatives.

Let's Talk Washington - that's the name of our get togethers with community members that have been held every month, different day/time, different location beginning this past May. The intent is that at some point we'll choose a convenient time/day for persons to attend. The purpose is for informal conversation to discuss concerns, ask questions and share ideas.

Along with myself, Police Chief Stevens regularly attends LTW. One Alderperson at each meeting, our Interim City Administrator, Dennis Carr, attend as their schedules allow.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR – *Dennis Carr*

- The Finance Director position has been posted. Interviews are tentatively scheduled for the second week of December.
- The Community Christmas Tree has been ordered.

ENGINEERING – *Dennis Carr, Ross Fuller & Mike Genard*

- The City received an APWA Project of the year award for the Nofsinger Realignment Project.
- New curb has been slipped throughout the mainline for phase II of the Catherine St. Reconstruction Project. Stark's concrete crew is currently working to get inlets set to the correct elevations and forming up the remaining curb that will be poured by hand. We anticipate having all the new curb installed by the end of next week.
- All of the new storm sewer pipe, inlets, and manholes have been installed for The Stormwater Priority Project for roads SE of the square. Once Stark's concrete crew completes the curb on Catherine they will begin curb work throughout the intersections for this project. We hope to get these roads milled and overlaid before the winter.
- Worked has resumed for the Grant St. SRTS project. Stark has completed the installation of two new ADA ramps and the majority of the remaining sidewalk that was delayed due to utility conflicts. We are still waiting for Ameren to relocate an electrical pedestal before the last section of sidewalk can be installed. Tazewell County Asphalt will complete milling and patching in front of the new driveways next week.
- Lonewolf Concrete has completed the removal and replacement of several sections of heaved and deteriorated concrete throughout the Washington Plaza drainage ditch. 200 lineal feet of concrete has been replaced to enhance the flow and longevity of the drainage ditch.
- The North St. SRTS project is nearly complete. Prairie View has started grading and dirt work in preparation of sod placement. The crosswalk at North St. and Main St. is scheduled to be milled and overlaid next week.
- We met with ICCI and PJ Hoerr to discuss the Candlewood Bridge Project. They plan to begin clearing the brush this year to allow ample room for equipment. Concrete work throughout the road was discussed as well. The contractor is weighing options as to whether they want to begin any of that work this winter. The majority of the project will not start until the spring of 2026.

- UCM completed the paving of Business 24, side road approaches, and the square. Pavement striping cannot be completed for a minimum of 14 days after asphalt is laid.
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FINANCE – Joanie Baxter

- Annual Treasurer’s Report analysis – I completed for the vendor portion and Jill completed for the payroll portion. Awaiting file financial statement and Comptroller’s report to complete.
 - Completed the quarterly report for the DCEO grant for the Evidence Building as related to payroll due October 31, 2025 and Reimbursement Request #2.
 - Completed the filing of the Police Pension Fund Annual Report, including interrogatories due October 27, 2025.
 - Performed a thorough review of the draft audit, journal entries, and footnotes. Reviewed questions with auditors and awaiting a final draft.
 - Submitted application for IPRF safety grant in the amount of \$4,782 for 2025.
 - Started analysis for tax levy discussion, including review of Police Pension Fund Actuarial Study.
 - Prepared agenda items for the Police Pension Board meeting scheduled for Monday, November 3, 2025.
 - Continued discussions with IT360 and Mike Genard regarding SharePoint and the benefits of transitioning to a cloud-based solution for shared files. This will provide an opportunity to completely overhaul the file directory structure to make accessing files within and across departments more efficient and seamless. Started planning new file structure for the Finance Group and copying files into SharePoint.
 - Started building my Accounting Calendar, Task Lists, and Agenda Builder items on Monday which is a new collaborative work management software that staff is implementing.
 - Participated in meeting for review of Enterprise Fleet Management system.
 - Jill processed and I reviewed payroll for October 24, 2025
 - Utility Billing (October 18 – 31, 2025)
 - A total of 19 cutoffs were processed for September billing and 29 door knockers were distributed and 20 payment arrangements made
 - A total of seven accounts were sent to Collections for September disconnects
 - A total of four accounts were sent to Collections for October disconnects
 - New accounts and account closings processed:
 - 14 ins
 - 10 outs
 - Leak detection through RNI and Sensus Analytics software – 18 leaks were caught and residents/businesses notified

PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT – Jon Oliphant & Joe Boyer

- As previously noted, the November PZC meeting will have one case: A request from Robinson Outdoor, LLC, on behalf of Eagle Ridge Development Company, LLC, for a large billboard variance at 1230 Peoria Street. There are three components to the variance: 1) To allow a large billboard adjacent to a road with a maximum permissible speed limit of less than 55 miles per hour; 2) To allow a large billboard to be located less than 20 feet from the property line; and 3) To allow a large billboard to be located within less than 500 feet from the nearest lot line of any residential zoned lot. The zoning code classifies a large billboard as an off-premise sign of larger than 64 square feet. Billboards are only permitted adjacent to a corridor with a speed limit of at least 55 mph, necessitating a variance request. The petitioner submitted a variance application for a similar sign that was considered in October 2024 and staff continues to have concerns about its proposed location given the traffic volume and proximity to schools and its students. The proposed sign is slightly smaller than the previous version (200 square feet in 2024 vs. 128 square feet now) and would be about 20’ in height. The PZC will serve as an advisory body for that case and its recommendation would go to the Council for a first reading ordinance.

- An HPC meeting will be scheduled for November 18 for the Certificate of Appropriateness application for the former Foster's Jewelry building at 104 N. Main for proposed exterior renovations that will house Mud Creek Mercantile. The business is tentatively scheduled to open by the second week of November. It will be a great addition to the Square!
- Staff is awaiting the submittal of a COA application for the former Brunk's building at 122 N. Main and it is anticipated that it will be submitted early next week to allow it to also be placed on the HPC meeting agenda for November 18. The primary building components will be addressing structural issues with the northwest corner and while improving that, adding new windows and a new entry door that enhances ADA accessibility.
- The Sleep Inn Commercial Building and Property Improvement Grant Program project that consisted of parking lot and landscaping upgrades has been completed. This will be scheduled for Council payment authorization upon receipt of a copy of the paid invoices. This is the first of four grant program projects to be completed.
- Exterior painting has been completed on the Ben Franklin building at 1503 Washington Road. According to the owner, asphalt work could be done around Thanksgiving, the replacement of the mansard roof will tentatively be done around the start of the new year, and landscaping will be done in the spring.
- This month's Technical Working Group meeting focused on providing feedback as part of a comprehensive plan that Peoria County is currently working on with a consulting team.
- Staff attended a code enforcement workshop organized by Tazewell County. These are great opportunities for staffs to network and bounce ideas off one another.
- Staff completed training with Tyler Technologies staff following the recent integration of a short-term rental permitting process into the system.
- The Discover Peoria third quarter report is attached.

PUBLIC SAFETY – Chief Stevens

- In August 2024, WPD sent an officer through ILEAS to help secure the Democratic National Convention in Chicago. On October 20, the City was reimbursed over \$5,100 for that assignment.
- Officer Joe Dubois graduated from the Kane County Sheriff's Canine Handler Training Program and is now in service with Styx, a lab trained in scent detection and tracking.
- We expected the evidence building to be substantially complete by the end of October, but scheduling issues are likely to push that into the second week of November.
- The speed trailer was on the 1400 block of Santa Fe from October 15 - 25, 2025. The 85th percentile speed in this 25 MPH zone was 29 MPH, meaning 85% of vehicles detected were at 29 MPH or less. The 50th percentile was 23 MPH. Of 8,390 vehicles detected, 63 were clocked over 35 MPH, with 5 of those over 40 MPH. The mean speed was 20 MPH.
- The PD collects prescription drugs for disposal throughout the year and delivers them to the DEA twice a year. The October delivery netted over 200 pounds of drugs that otherwise could be diverted to illegal use or end up in a landfill. DEA arranges safe incineration of the collected drugs.
- Gillman data after the placement of speed humps:

Eastbound: 85th percentile speed 27 MPH, 50th percentile 22 MPH, 10 MPH Pace 17-27, mean 22.8

Eastbound speeders over 35 MPH: 92 (heaviest 8 AM – 11 AM)

PUBLIC WORKS – Brian Rittenhouse

- Staff will start burning the brush collected on Monday. Once completed the excavator will be used to line Farm Creek, adjacent to the wastewater treatment plant, with rip rap for erosion control.
 - Staff is still working on equipment and scheduling of the water treatment plant chlorine switch.
 - Staff is waiting to hear back from the insurance company and their decision on the Jefferson Street Building. They will decide if insurance will cover bringing the roof up to code.
 - Hydrant flushing started on the Plant #2 side of the City and will last about 2-3 weeks. Dead ends hydrants throughout the City will also be flushed. Plant #1 side will be completed after it makes the switch to a free chlorine.
 - The siding and roofing of the Woodland Trail storage building is now scheduled to take place in mid-November.
 - Public Works held a safety meeting to discuss trenching and shoring, lock out tag out and winter weather.

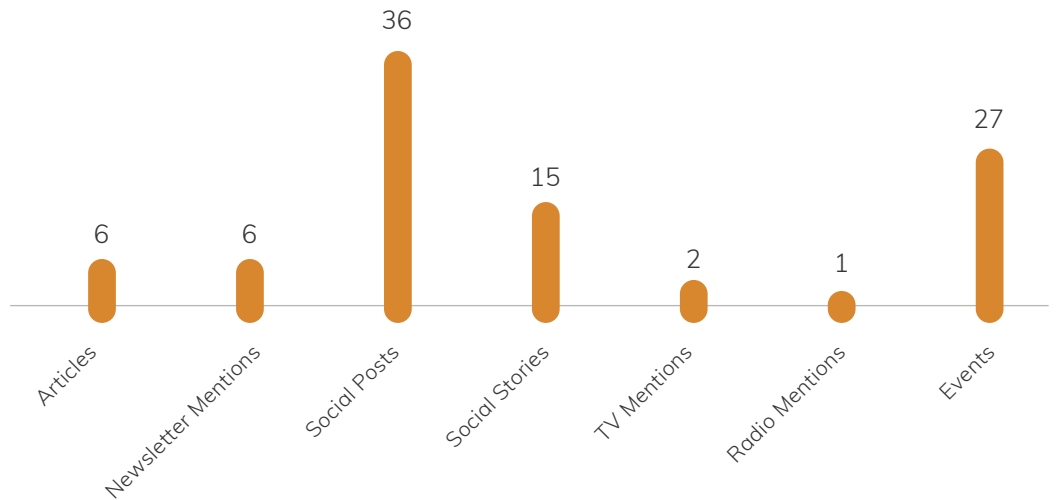
