Lauterbach & Amen, LLP Presentation: Audited Financial Statements Auditor Hanna Colorten shared the following points regarding the annual audit:

- The independent auditor's report issued the highest possible opinion, reflecting a clean and accurate audit.
- Pages 19–20 outline details of the City's net position for governmental activities.
- The Statement of Activities shows revenues and annual expenses, with increases from the prior year.
- The Notes to the Financial Statements, beginning on page 37, include information on farm and tower leases and their expiration dates.
- Pages 51–52 highlight numerous new projects and the completion of various infrastructure, vehicle, and equipment leases.
- Page 53 summarizes the City's long-term debt—including bonds, loans, and leases—payable through 2030.
- Pages 60–61 provide information on pensions, major projects, and remaining payment obligations.
- A 10-year history of fund schedules is provided on page 71.
- The management letter includes recommendations, new rules and regulations, IT security notes, and emerging risks; no issues were identified.
- New reporting standards (GASB 102 and 103) will take effect over the next two years.
- Finance Director Baxter clarified that "net position" is government-wide terminology that includes all assets and capital investments; it does not represent cash on hand.
