Call to Order Mayor Gary W. Manier called the regular meeting of Monday, June 15, 2015 to order at 6:47

p.m. in the Library Meeting Room at Five Points Washington.

Approve Consent Agenda

Adoption of this ordinance would set the general prevailing rate of wages for laborers,

mechanics and other works engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of this City to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Tazewell County areas as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 2015. Alderman J. Gee moved and Alderman Moss seconded to waive second reading and proceed with adoption of the ordinance as read. On roll call the vote was:

City Clerk Brown provided first reading of the following ordinance, by title and brief synopsis: an ordinance authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement between the City of Washington, Tazewell County, Illinois and the Washington Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad, Inc. for fire protection services, ambulance and emergency medical services, and compensation. Adoption of this ordinance would approve and authorize the execution of a Memorandum of Agreement with the Washington Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad for fire protection, ambulance and emergency medical services, and compensation. This agreement extends two previous agreements for a six-month period of time effective May 1, 2015 through October 31, 2015. Alderman Moss moved and Alderman Brucks seconded to waive second reading and proceed with adoption of the ordinance as read. On roll call the vote was:

City Clerk Brown provided first reading of the following ordinance, by title and brief synopsis: An ordinance authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into an Agreement between the City of Washington, Tazewell County, Illinois and the Washington Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad, Inc. establishing compensation for fire/rescue service and compensation for ambulance service for the period beginning May 1, 2015 and ending October 31, 2015. Adoption of this ordinance would approve and authorize the execution of an agreement between the City of Washington and the Washington Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad regarding compensation for the provision of fire and ambulance services for a period of May 1, 2015 through October 31, 2015. The total amount of compensation payable by the City of Washington to the Washington Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad is \$300,000. Alderman Brucks moved and Alderman T. Gee seconded to waive second reading and proceed with adoption of the ordinance as read. On roll call the vote was:

Alderman Brownfield moved and Alderman Moss seconded to adopt the ordinance authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into an Agreement between the City of Washington, Tazewell County, Illinois and the Washington Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad, Inc. establishing compensation for fire/rescue service and compensation for ambulance service for the period beginning May 1, 2015 and ending October 31, 2015. There was no discussion and on roll call the vote was:

City Clerk Brown provided first reading of the following ordinances, by title and brief synopsis: an ordinance changing the street name of Holborn to Holborn Court. Adoption of this ordinance would change the street name of Holborn to Holborn Court; an ordinance amending Chapter 132 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Washington, Tazewell County, Illinois entitled "Offenses Against Persons." Adoption of this ordinance would make the possession of electronic cigarettes by a minor a violation of City ordinance; an ordinance designating Central Avenue intersections in the City of Washington as stop intersections, and designating West Street and Ridge Street as through streets. Adoption of this ordinance would designate the two Central Avenue intersections as stop intersections; an ordinance amending Chapter 71 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Washington, Tazewell County, Illinois, entitled "Rules of Operation" to establish maximum speed limits along portions of S. Main Street. Adoption of this ordinance would decrease the speed limit on S. Main Street between the 800 and 1100 blocks from 45 miles per hour to 35 miles per hour; and an ordinance amending the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Washington, Tazewell County, Illinois, by rezoning 2598 Centennial Drive from R-1A to CE. Adoption of this ordinance would rezone 2598 Centennial Drive from

1<sup>st</sup> reading ord, street name change, Holborn to Holborn Court; amending Chapter 132, regulating e-cigarettes and minors; designating stop intersections, Central Avenue; amending Chapter 71, reducing speed limit along portion of S. Main St.; rezoning 2598 Centennial Drive from R-1A to CE 1<sup>st</sup> reading ord, Cont.)

R-1A (Single-Family Residential) to CE (Country Estates).

These ordinances will be listed on the July 6<sup>th</sup> meeting agenda for action.

Asphalt Supplier Additional Consideration Public Works Director Andrews requested Council authorization to modify the annual asphalt commodity bid to have allowance to purchase from Tazewell County Asphalt (2<sup>nd</sup> lowest bid) when RA Cullinan is not producing hot mix asphalt at their plant. He shared that next year this option will be included in the bid specifications. Alderman Brucks moved and Alderman J. Gee seconded to authorize the request as presented. On roll call the vote was:

Payment authrz, STP #2 repairs, progress payment #5, River City Construction

Public Works Director Andrews requested payment authorization for progress payment #5 to River City Construction in the amount of \$62,039.60 for the work that has been completed through May 13, 2015 on the storm related repairs at STP No. 2. He shared that this work includes many of the items identified in the review and startup of the Chlorine Building conducted on March 31, 2015 for seasonal disinfection. Alderman Brownfield moved and Alderman T. Gee seconded to authorize the request as presented. On roll call the vote was:

STP #2, Phase 2A Strand contract amendment Public Works Director Andrews requested Council authorization to amend the October 17, 2013 STP #2, Phase 2A improvements agreement for bidding and construction related services from \$198,000 to \$221,300. He shared that much of this work was temporarily suspended due to the November tornado and subsequently the State has made the City eligible for Grant assistance which will require effort to revise the previously loan based documents to that of the Grant program. He shared that Public Works Committee has worked through the timeline as well. Alderman J. Gee moved and Alderman Maxwell seconded to authorize the request as presented. On roll call the vote was:

Aldermen's Comments

Public Works Director Andrews provided an update on the roadway restoration project noting the following: 1) a pre-construction meeting was held with Cullinan this morning; 2) equipment is being moved into the project area; 3) the intention is to get the work completed this construction season; 4) the Mayor has suggested a public information meeting that will be scheduled June 25<sup>th</sup> from 4-6 p.m. and will be conducted as an open house forum (location yet to be determined); 5) a weekly progress meeting will be held and updates will be posted to the City's website; and 6) targeted blocks in the project area will receive door handouts when construction is targeted to begin. Mayor Manier encouraged everyone to attend the June 25<sup>th</sup> meeting.
