



6/16/25 City Council Meeting Recap:

Proclamation: “Juneteenth Community Recognition Day”

A portion of the proclamation, read by Mayor Stevens, states, “Whereas, the City of Washington will observe Thursday, June 19, 2025, as part of our commitment to racial and social justice, and encourage a day of reflection, recognition and acknowledgement of healing. We recognize the continued need to address racism and to continue our efforts to build a more peaceful and cohesive community.”

June 19th is a Federal Holiday. City Hall will be closed on Thursday, June 19, 2025.

Approved Consent Agenda items include:

- WFD purchase to replace the Fire Department Exhaust Removal System.
- Renewal of the City’s property and liability insurance with Selective Insurance.
- Coalition for cyber liability insurance provides the City with a lower premium cost.
- Renewal for City FY25-26 participation with the Greater Peoria Economic Development Council.

Mayoral Communications: Mayor Stevens, Police Chief Stevens and Alderperson Ernst will be in attendance at our next Let’s Talk Washington Event (a meet the mayor and chat with city officials type of event) that will be held at the Washington Library Sunnyland Branch on Wednesday, June 18th at 3 - 4pm.

Grandyle Relief Sewer - Priority Project 3 - Bid Award was approved. This project involves the installation of a relief sewer and sidewalk along the west side of Grandyle, from Mackenzie to Elgin.
