

## **City of Washington Public Safety Committee Meeting Minutes – March 20, 2017**

- 1. Aldermen wishing to be heard on a non-agenda item:** None
- 2. Citizens wishing to be heard on a non-agenda items:** Gerald Wolfe, 607 Westgate – his concerns are as follows:
  - Speeding on Devonshire Road
  - Westgate Park entrance – visually impossible to see pedestrians, or cars coming out of the park area due to parked cars on both sides of the roadway.
  - Westgate parking on both sides of roadway causing safety hazard due to narrow roadway-asking for no parking or parking on one side only.
  - Running stop sign at Westgate & Devonshire Road

A discussion amongst attendees ensued over these topics. Safety being the key, all agreed to explore some various options. Jim Culotta will be speaking with Ed Andrews, City Engineer, to see what possibilities exist. Police Department placed counters on Devonshire Rd (average of 30mph) numerous citations and warning tickets issued. The department will continue to keep this location in the rotation for directed patrol. All will move forward and recommend some ideas at the next meeting.

Paul Spiezio asked Committee about status of electric speed sign. City will check to see what the status of the order is and advise him. Police department records reflect on-going enforcement on Dallas Road. Issuance of warning and citations continues.
